



BAGS LISTED IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER

BAG BOY / \$170

The rotating top of the NXO Revolver has individual shaft notches to prevent banging (bagboycompany.com).

BURTON / \$160

Weighing 6.5 pounds, the Hybrid CXS has legs that lock into either cart or carry mode (forefrontgolf.com).

BURTON / \$120

The Monoshock 100 weighs 3.8 pounds, and the legs function off a spring coil (forefrontgolf.com).

CALLAWAY / \$150

The ORG. 14 Weekender is designed to be crush-resistant and lightweight (callawaygolf.com).

NIKE / \$175

The Tour Cart II has 12 forward-facing pockets and an external putter tube (nikegolf.com).

NIKE / \$140

The dual strap of the 3.9-pound Xtreme Light II converts to a single strap for caddies (nikegolf.com).

PING / \$190

The five-pound Latitude has ample storage, and the ball pocket can detach to be a shag bag (pinggolf.com).

PING / \$170

Two well-placed front handles make the durable, tubeconstruction Pioneer easy to tote (pinggolf.com).

SUN MOUNTAIN / \$180

The seven-pound MPB is a hybrid with a dual strap and legs that zipper shut for cart use (sunmountain.com).

TAYLORMADE / \$140

The 6.2-pound Monza features seven full-length club dividers (taylormadegolf.com).

TITLEIST / \$175

At 5.6 pounds, the x88 is a wise choice for the walker who carries more than a rainsuit (titleist.com).

WILSON / \$130

The 5.5-pound Staff Tour Carry has an ergonomic hip pad and an insulated water bottle pocket (wilson.com).



PING FREESTYLE

Stable, double-bend Mantis legs helped this five-pound bag perform well in the Topple Test. Another clever feature is the secondary spring-wire stay that runs around the middle to maintain bag structure for smooth club removal. With walkers in mind, the dual straps are curved to fit the shoulders better.



SUN MOUNTAIN C-130 \$180

Here's the only model to make Hot List Gold two years in a row, and for good reason: This veteran has a reverse-orientation top to make clubs more accessible from the back of a cart, three lift handles, two fulllength clothing pockets and a zippered tunnel to keep the carry strap secure and out of the way when it needs to be.



SUN MOUNTAIN ZERO-G \$200

Weighing just 3.5 pounds, this is the lightest bag to make our list. Even better is the Velcro-closure padded hip strap (adjustable to fit 26-inch to 49-inch hips) that relieves pressure from the neck and shoulders to make the bag feel even lighter. A definite upgrade in convenience over last year's Hug system.



TITLEIST X86 \$140

Walkers will be challenged to find a better value than this 4.5-pound, no-nonsense scheme. The backpack straps adjust easily at four points, the six-way divider top is simple and the hip pad is comfy without being cumbersome. The meshcovered lift handle is a nice touch for quick maneuvers at the tee box and the trunk.
